### **Bring Back the Village Officer?**

Scottish Government Consultation on 'Community Empowerment and Renewal'

'These are uniquely challenging times.. (in which we must) ...unlock the knowledge, abilities and potential of all of Scotland's communities.'

So says the introduction to this new Scottish Government consultation exercise—a pre-legislative process designed to help formulate a Bill which, after further consultation, will reach the Scottish Parliament early in 2013. In their current form, the proposals lack coherence and definition, but two key aspects are of continuing interest us:

- increasing engagement of communities in the planning and delivery of local public services; and
- community ownership of public assets to be used for the common good.

As a community we are already engaged with our local authority, Stirling Council, in these respects and we hope for further progress on both fronts. (Was a Village Officer not a good idea?) At the same time this national consultation is one of a number which will help shape the capacity of Scottish communities' to influence local service provision and facilities in the future. It is vital, therefore, that every individual and organisation with a viewpoint responds. The deadline has been extended until September 26th.

#### The New Coop

Unfortunately the meeting began with a disappointment. We expected a presentation from the Coop on the development of its new store, but no-one arrived. (We are assured that this will now take place at our September meeting)

#### **Community Benefits from Duntreath Garden Show**

The Duntreath Garden Show in June saw significant inputs from our community - including both Church and Community Council members. Our thanks to all the volunteers.

In recognition of these efforts it was reported that a sum of £2000 has been given back to the community. The Community Council formally administers this money and it was agreed that it should be disposed as follows: £800 towards the cost of permanent floodlighting for Strathblane Parish Church; £500 towards the Playpark; and £700 to be made available for other community projects.

#### **Green Belt Tightened**

An import victory to report: the Reporter's decision dismissing the appeal for three house on a plot of land in Mugdock was welcomed with great satisfaction. It unequivocally reinforces the Green Belt a way that strengthens Stirling planners' hand and gives clarity to developers thus avoiding wasteful applications of this kind in future. #### **Progress with Prepared** Meals Discussions

The Bannockburn Pilot for frozen meals will soon be completed and we need to firm up our proposals for the meals on wheels provision and the lunch club. We expect the Council will roll out provision of the frozen meals service as quickly as they can once the pilot scheme ends. At the request of local volunteers the CC is working with the lunch club and meals on wheels to see if it is possible and affordable to provide a local alternative provision to frozen meals. We would like to offer local residents a choice when they are asked to decide about frozen meals. We will meet again later this month. Any change of venue to the Village Club, to ensure compliance with Environmental Health requirements, is dependent on the lowering of the kerb. Renovations to the Village Club kitchens are complete. Issues raised at the SCC meeting will be discussed. If decisions are made to offer an alternative meal provision, the recruitment of volunteers will be essential.

In order to support the meals provision, over the summer and with the support of the CDT a grant proposal was submitted to cover such things as equipment renewal, support of volunteers including any training needs, and the registration with the PVG scheme.

#### PROPOSED LOCAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN

Last year the Community Council put in a lot of work in collecting and representing community views on Stirling Council's *Draft* Proposed Local Development Plan (LDP). Stirling Council will discuss the Proposed LDP in September and, if approved, it will be published on October 15th.

There is then an eight week formal consultation period - up to December 10th - and it will, be open for all organisations and individuals to make written representations in this process.

The LDP will feature on our Community Council agenda for November and we will hold a **Public Meeting in mid-November** before making any formal community response.

#### About the SCDT

The SCDT is a company, limited by guarantee, and a registered charity whose purpose is "to assist in improving the quality of life for those who live and work in Strathblane, Blanefield and Mugdock, and also for visitors to the area, working in partnership with other organisations or individuals."

It is a community-owned company with a current membership of about 200 local people and is operated by a voluntary Board of Directors appointed by the members. Members are informed and consulted about activities and outputs and through a number of channels. These include Newsletters, monthly reports in the Blane Valley Bulletin and an AGM (to be held this year on Wednesday 26 September at 7.30 in the Village Club).

The SCDT led the exercise of producing our Community Action Plan with the Community Council.

As a community-based organisation, the SCDT depends on the voluntary efforts of members and aims to mobilise the wide range of experience and talent available in our community for the common good. The preferred approach in the pursuit of community priorities is through the establishment of working groups of volunteers. (A brief report on current Groups and Projects is provided on this page).

#### **SCDT- Activity Update**

**Allotments** -The site at the old railway track was officially opened by Sir Archie and Lady Juliet Edmonstone on Saturday 2 June. All 30 plots have been taken up by local residents and a waiting list is operational. Layouts are in place and uniform greenhouses/sheds are being erected. Margaret Meager chairs of BVAG and Dai Hutchinson is CDT Director.

**Paths Development Group -** Funding services are being explored for the potential upgrade of the old railway line from the allotments entrance to Station Road. Informal discussions are taking place with Scottish Wildlife Trust on the possibilities of a new walking route from Strathblane to the Loch Ardinning Reserve. Alan Hutton is the lead director of this group which comprises John Malloy, Keith Vass, George Thom and Ian Wright.

**Music for Young People -** Discussions are in train with Stirling Council Youth Services Group (Art, Music, Culture) on providing a pilot programme (8-10 sessions) of popular music by professional musicians and tutors in the Autumn. A "taster" session is earmarked for mid September in the Kirk Rooms (see Calendar on Page 4 and notices on the website and around the village) Gordon Ash is the lead director of a project group which comprising Moira Barnes-Graham, Frankie Ritchie, Richard Begg and John Gray.

**Property Group -** Working on the lease for the gravediggers' bothy at Strathblane Parish Church. Monitoring status and development activity at the "Toilets" site and the Kirkhouse Inn. The Group includes David Dool, Alan Dickson and Ian Hamilton.= with Dai Hutchison as lead Director

**Interpretive Map/Signage -** Potential paths/walkways and landmarks have been trialled over the summer months and appropriate funding sources for publication and marketing are being explored. Jude Gregor is the lead director of this project with assistance from Anne Balfour and Jim Neill.

**Greenheart -** Fundraising continues for the final phase (potentially a Bird's Nest Tower and Whirlwind) of the toddlers' playpark. Stirling Council Land Services are now investigating and costing a relevant drainage scheme for the possibility of a grass MUGA (recreational games area for teenagers) and also researching different types of stored equipment. The Group comprises Linda Barclay, Steve McCooey, Susie Ure and Christine Baume, with Robert Davy as lead Director.

**Village Photo History Book** -Hoping to publish in the Autumn. Anne Balfour is the lead director with assistance from Martin Shields and Murray O'Donnell.
