Community Council August Update — from SCC Secretary Grace Edmonds

Our August meeting started with Margaret Vass congratulating all of the members of the community who took part in the **Mugstock Festival** for their excellent performances and thanking the organisers for showcasing local talent.

Police Report: There have been a number of thefts of tools in recent weeks, mainly from unsecured outbuildings. A motor cycle was stolen from a lock up in the village and subsequently recovered from the river. There has also been an increase in bike thefts from campsites around Loch Lomond.

Several motor vehicle accidents have also occurred during July, although fortunately there were no serious injuries. Police Scotland are continuing to conduct speed checks in Blanefield and the surrounding villages.

There was also a reminder that The Air Weapons and Licensing (Scotland) Act comes into effect on December $31^{\rm st}$ 2016.

Draft Local Development Plan: Much of the meeting was spent discussing this. There are no surprises for our area as we have already agreed the zones marked for development. Discussion about the development of the Killearn Hospital site is ongoing and we intend to ask Killearn Community Council to include us in their discussions as we believe that any development on the site will also affect our village.

Primary School 50th Anniversary: The school plans to hold several activities to mark this anniversary and the children want to talk to some of the older residents to collect information about the history of the village. The Community Council has agreed to host an afternoon tea for older people to meet the children. More details about this can be found elsewhere in the Bulletin.

Broadband: No more information is currently available about the expansion of high speed broadband in the village, despite a member of the Community Council repeatedly asking for this. He will continue to pursue BT for answers but believes that we need a Blanefield & Strayhblane Broadband Group similar to that in Killearn to take this forward. Any volunteers to join such a group will be most welcome. We will continue to report on any progress

Local Development Plan — The adopted Stirling Local Development Plan 2014 is currently under review and, in this regard, a Proposed Plan, draft Action Programme and Environmental Report were approved for consultation at a meeting of Stirling Council on 30 June 2016.
