NEW YEAR—NEW WAYS OF WORKING FOR THE COMMUNITY!

Margaret Vass, SCC Chair writes:

The BVB is two years old. The Community Council established it to keep residents in touch with what is going on in the villages, to try to engage people and give everyone the chance to be informed—and to give their views—on important community issues.

From feedback we have received, some of you find the news sheet boring — although you love the back page and find it really useful!

Well let us be honest too! I know many of you do volunteer, but lots of village organisations struggle to get people to help and a few of us sometimes feel fed up with being the ones left to do too many things around our community. We intend that things should be different this year as Community Councillors would like to have a life without feeling guilty about not arranging something or doing something in the villages. Importantly many of us who have just been re-elected will not be standing in 2017 and 'succession planning' is needed! The community needs more volunteers.

We have to change the way some things are done. For example, we will not plant the village tubs ourselves and it will only happen if others agree to help. The more helpers we get the less time it takes; just now four people have to put in half a day twice a year. In April we will be asking for volunteers, so come on allotment folk, keen gardeners and ex-members of the gardening club step up to the plate and help! We can then form a group independent of the SCC - like those in other local villages - who will take this important work on. This can happen with other tasks you ask us to take on; we will enable but not necessarily do them.

The one thing we will do is the BVB which we have plans to develop, and perhaps expand in the coming year.

We have worked really hard over the last four years to promote community spirit and a feeling of well-being. It is now time to see if that can bear fruit. Do you really want to be part of a vibrant community, or are you content to be a suburb of Glasgow? We fully understand that most lead very busy lives but if more people offer to help you don't need to give much time. It is great socially, you meet lots of people and, dare I say it, have FUN!

The Community Council in January

Here we focus on the major issues discussed at the January meeting of the SCC. Some are dealt with in more detail elsewhere in this issue, and the full minute will be available as usual on the website and the village noticeboards.

Priority Based Budgeting: The future of local public services is the biggest issue facing the community at the moment. The meeting had a detailed discussion of its reaction to the SC priority Based Budget options and in many cases reluctantly agreed to support a number of proposals. In accepting the proposal to move to a four-weekly grey bin collection it was agreed, that residents should be expected to take more responsibility for refuse. There was widespread support for a relaxation of the Council Tax squeeze - and the implementation of a long-overdue property valuation to help maintain essential services.

Community Empowerment Bill Consultation: There was disappointment all round that the draft bill put so little stress on the role of Community Councils and the importance of community democracy in general. The CC will submit its comments by January 24th.

Communication Strategy: It was agreed that in the coming months the CC should work on three fronts: first, to develop a Welcome Pack giving information on the Villages for new residents—the SCC agree funding for this; second, to expand what the BVB can offer by investigating the feasibility of a quarterly 'colour' supplement reporting on village events; and, thirdly, to try to work with our webmaster to see if the village website can further expand what it offers.

Police Report: PC McNally's report featured a number of break-ins and thefts over the last few weeks (full details at www.strathblanefield.org.uk) He noted that in many cases valuable items had been left within easy reach. Residents and businesses are reminded to keep valuable property secure and out of sight at all times. Anyone seeing anything they believe to be suspicious should report the matter immediately by dialling 101 (999 in an emergency).

Litter on the Football Field: The SCC had also been advised of littering on the football field after matches which a resident had regularly cleaned up but was no longer willing to do so. The SCC agreed to contact Blane Field Thistle and

Campsie Road Housing Development

The Community Panel convened by RSHA met with representatives of the developer Cala Homes to discuss their revised proposals for the site which are likely to form the basis of a planning application to Stirling Council in February. The plan is now for 28 houses including 14 affordable homes ranging from one bedroom flats to a three bedroom bungalow.

A number of issues were raised by community members mainly relating to significant potential traffic problems (and the need for major traffic calming), footpaths, access to the site and the need for the new housing to blend well into the character of the village. All of these issues should be taken up by the planners in Stirling and we can all comment again when the application is submitted. We hope to be able to display the latest plans in Strathblane Library in the next couple of weeks.

Assuming all goes well with the application, and with funding availability for RSHA, it looks as if building could begin in 2014-15 for the private houses, and 2015-16 for the much needed affordable homes.

Once again we should stress that in order to ensure that we get the mix of housing that we need, anyone potentially interested in renting an affordable home on this site should register their interest with Rural Stirling Housing Association—more information on the village website.

STRATHBLANEFIELD COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT TRUST

Path Development Group

Following the successful completion of our Feasibility Study of the **upgrading of the old Railway Path to Station Road** the next task is to complete the construction of the upgrade together with a link path to the bridge on Station Road. If our fundraising strategy is effective (there is much work to be done) we hope to see work completed during 2015.

With the help of *Living Streets* we have completed a 'street audit' of the difficult walking conditions down Station Road. The aim of this exercise - which we plan to repeat in other parts of the villages—is to identify problems for all kinds of walkers and to come up with potential solutions to them. The Station Road report will shortly be available on the village website. In this case 'solutions' are not always easy to find but we are keen to get the experiences and ideas of those who live nearby.

In the next couple of weeks we hope to have discussions with **Scottish Water** on the possibility of a real 'community benefit' from the lengthy project in the form of a thoroughly resurfaced path alongside the football field and a new high quality walking and cycling route up the hill from the Allotments entrance to the Gowk Stane Road. That new path can then form part of the new **John Muir Trail** a cross-country long distant path to be opened in April and which will pass through Strathblane. First World War Group

Set up to research, and produce a booklet on, those men from the villages who died in WW1 and who are named on the War Memorial, this project goes on apace unearthing some fascinating material. This month it got feature coverage in *The Herald*, the *Stirling Observer* and the *Milngavie & Bearsdan Herald*.

In the first half of 2014 the Trust aims to increase membership and expand the set of active groups with community projects that operate under its auspices. Life membership costs only £5.

STRATHBLANE BOWLING CLUB IS 'DEVELOPMENT CLUB OF THE YEAR'

At the Stirling Sports Awards Evening on 19th November at Dunblane Hydro, where all aspects of sporting activity were represented, Strathblane Bowling Club beat six other nominees to win the '**Development Club of the Year**' award. The award was given for the Club's work with Strathblane Primary School pupils during the 2013 bowling season. Club members gave their time both in the final school term and during the summer holiday period to tutor the pupils in the basics of bowling. This after school club project was run in conjunction with Active Stirling and with the backing of the school. Initially six P5-7 pupils joined but, through their keenness and enthusiasm, the word spread amongst their friends and by the end of September over twenty were regularly attending. In September a team of six pupils from Strathblane played a match against juniors from Torrance Bowling Club. Honours were shared and a good level of skill was shown by all. In addition, one afternoon in June all pupils from P5-7 —over sixty children—came to the Club for a brief introduction to bowling.

The Bowling Club starts its season again in April this year and intend to restart the after school club. Having managed to enthuse the younger people of Strathblane, there is now a challenge to teenagers and adults – go along and join with the members of the bowling club for a taster session and see how sociable and competitive the sport is.
