Shaping our Community's Future—New Challenges & Opportunities WE NEED YOUR INPUT!

Four circumstances currently come together that require us, as a community, to make decisions that will help shape the future of our community. But, as the cliche has it, **'challenges are also opportunities'**. Right now:

- our four year old Community Action Plan must be reviewed and updated (see insert)
- our **50 year old Primary School**, created for an earlier pattern of education and currently needing over £700,000 worth of fabric repairs, is reaching the end of its useful life;
- at the same time our local library housed in a temporary building must be replaced (or closed) within five years;
- in the face of extreme fiscal 'austerity' Stirling Council is offering more community autonomy in setting priorities and managing assets and services.

The February *Community Summit* highlighted the importance to everyone of the **built infrastructure** of our community— amongst other things including the **environment** and **social care**.

The once in a generation opportunity of a replacement school—the most significant piece of community infrastructure we have—cannot be allowed to pass without considering all the ways we might use it to enhance facilities and opportunities for community members, from youngsters outside school hours to all kinds of sporting and lifelong learning activities for everyone, and services for senior citizens — and a new community library. Stirling Council, who cannot promise us a new school at the moment - and if they did would probably provide an off-the-peg building with fewer rooms than currently— is, nevertheless keen to go into partnership with our community to develop much more flexible facilities that can serve our evolving community needs.

To begin with we need to establish as much information as we can on our current built environment, the present and likely future demands on it, and the possible forms that development could take. We need to establish what the realistic possibilities might be—the SCDT is currently seeking funding for an audit of community facilities and a feasibility study of alternative options. At the same time we need to assess carefully what kind of community we have been, are, might become or would hope to become.

Clearly we are still in the first stage of what will be a lengthy consultation process. At this point we need to get a sense of how community members see (or would like to see) the community now and in the future.

Community Council May Update — from SCC Chair Margaret Vass

We had another busy agenda this month. Our main discussions centred on the **community consultation** which features in this edition. We prepared for this by having a productive joint meeting with SCDT Board Members.

The **Scottish Water turbine project** is at last nearing completion and restoration work to the railway track has commenced. Neighbours are still complaining about large trucks damaging pavements and kerb stones though the latest damage was not Scottish Water trucks..

We are still trying to arrange another **heart start class** but limited resources at Scottish ambulance may mean we have to share with others. The good news is that we now have 4 first responders in the village who will provide prompt emergency response.

Police Scotland was yet again unable to attend our meeting. A written report was provided. There have been a small number of thefts and road traffic offences. A gang that had been targeting Coop stores across the country including ours has been apprehended. Concerns were raised again about vandalism and underage drinking in the area. We have also been asked to raise the issue of illegal parking around the school. Police Scotland has been alerted to this so you have been warned.

Three **planning applications** were discussed. Two involved Ardunan Lodge which is in the greenbelt. Previousapplications which were opposed by the CC resulted in approval for a replacement house and the demolition of the lodge. Now the applicant wishes to change the design of the house (an improvement) and retain the lodge. The CC agreed

to support the renovation of the lodge and oppose a new house in the greenbelt. The third application was retrospective and for the new wall at Valhalla. If the correct planning process had been followed provisions for appropriate drainage could have prevented the flooding at this location on Old Mugdock Road.

Everyone will have seen the pavement work on the main road beginning. This will include parking provision at the shops that will ensure that prams and wheelchairs can still use the pavement. We expect the road to be resurfaced in August. Details on the road closure will be included in the June BVB. The last time we had roadworks our local businesses lost a lot of money. Please make an effort to walk to the businesses affected - as ever if we don't use our local businesses we risk losing them!

For those of you wondering about our **brown grass verge** it will be planted with wild flowers to bring a bit of colour to the village along with our tubs. The aim is to reduce grass cutting costs.

Finally if after being **in hospital in Glasgow** you or a member of your family need help to enable to live at home when you are discharged DO NOT allow yourself to be moved to Larbert in order to access services. Stand your ground and insist that arrangements are made locally while you remain in the Glasgow hospital. If anyone has experienced difficulties like this we would like to know. The SCDT Annual General Meeting

Refreshments will be provide at the end of the meeting when members can watch a not to be missed slideshow on some of the successful projects that the Trust has been involved in over the last year.

As many will have noticed the **walk information boards** are now in place at the Church car-park, the Library and the War Memorial. The information, matches the the **Walks around Strathblane** leaflet - still available in local shops (Price £2). Both projects were led by Jude Gregor with funding from Stirling Council.

Path Development Group reports some progress since the April issue:

- A grant of £77,500 has been received from Sustrans (via Stirling Council) for the upgrading of the **old railway track path to Station Road**. This only represents half of the required amount and we are trying hard to find matching sources. **Any ideas and offers would be greatly appreciated (contact:** alanhutton@gmail.com)
- We are still awaiting as we were a month ago (!) the formal go-ahead from the Scottish Water Legal Department for the new **Link Path** from the railway track to the Gowk Stane Road .
- The **Scary Path Video** is now complete and can be viewed on the Paths for All website and on Youtube!
- preliminary work continues on an application for *Walkers are Welcome* accreditation for our community council area. Please sign the support forms which are in the Library and are soon to be available elsewhere.

From Gallipoli to Waterloo and Back Again

One of the most fascinating stories to come out of the Strathblane First World War Project was that of Lt William Ker of the Royal Naval Division, who fought at Gallipoli in 1915 before being killed at Beaucourt sur L'Ancre the following year. William and his family were great letter writers. After the publication of A Village Remembers, lead author Anne Johnstone volunteered to help sort out the Ker Family papers, in the hope of finding the letters William wrote home to his family at Easterton of Mugdock from the Dardanelles and the Western Front. Not only did she finally discover 90 of the young officer's letters, in the last of a dozen boxes and suitcases of papers kept by his niece. She also came across a 150 page-long handwritten unpublished account of the Battle of Waterloo, written in 1815 by William's great-great uncle, a merchant based in Brussels.

Anne is giving a talk about her genealogical adventure at Strathblane Library at 7.30pm on June 16,
— two days before the bi-centenary of Waterloo. All welcome.
