LOCAL DEVELOPMENT PLAN IN FINAL CONSULTATION STAGE

The proposed Local Development Plan 2014-2034 has been approved by Stirling Council and was published on 15 October. There will be an 8 week period for comments.

The Vision for the Stirling area in 2034; the detailed planning policies and land allocations; and the Overarching Policy & Sustainable Development Criteria that will apply to ALL developments are virtually unchanged from the draft plan which was consulted on locally in late 2011. Particular aspects affecting our community directly are:

- Green Belt strengthened in principle but redrawn in certain places.
- In "pressured" areas like ours, any development of 4 units or more should include 50% "affordable" housing.
- Land is to be allocated for 30 housing units on Campsie Rd site (H106 aka "Singh Field")
- Land is allocated for a Cemetery Extension beyond the Singh Field on Campsie Road
- The northern fringes of the Green Belt designation is deleted to the North side of B821 (Cuilts Road) & Auchineden areas.
- The field of trees below the Devil's Elbow is removed from the Green Belt, so that the south-eastern Green Belt boundary runs down the A81 into the village.

With regard to the site H106 Campsie Road ("Singh Field"), the plan recognises that this is a "Highly visible site requiring respect for sensitive settlement edge/countryside setting." A robust Green Belt boundary must be established, partly by the cemetery extension (in the Green Belt) and by "additional tree planting to create a permanent new edge to the settlement". There is proposal for a new footway over frontage to



meet existing footway at Station Lofts and a new crossing facility to assist safe route to school. A Tjunction would be made onto Campsie Road and the 30 mph limit would be extended beyond the new access point.

October Community Council

In this brief report we highlight major items dealt with at the October Community Council meeting. Some of these are followed up elsewhere in the Bulletin. Full minutes are available on the village website and noticeboards.

Planning correspondent John Gray reported the publication (on Oct. 15th) of the **LOCAL DEVELOP-MENT PLAN** now approved by Stirling Council. The details of what will become an important issue in the community over the next few weeks are fully covered on pages 1 & 2 of this issue.

Progress on Stirling's SINGLE **OUTCOME AGREEMENT** was reported. The SOA is the process by which community planning partners (LA; Health Board; Police; Regional Transport Board; Fire; Sustrans; and communities themselves) agree both priorities for spending and the outcomes (results) for communities. Margaret Vass and other SCC members have been active in the SW Stirling Community Forum's attempts to raise the profile of communities and the accountability of service providers in the next SOA. November

sees the next stage of the process. It can be followed at "Your Community Portal" on the SC website.

Willie Oswald reported continuing concerns about the footpaths going out of the village in either direction. They are dangerously impassable and using the bus at night proves risky as people have to walk, without adequate lighting, on the road. Information has been emailed to SC about this detailing the problems: on the A81 West to the care home and South to the Country House Hotel; and the A891 – no footpath to Dunglass View. A concerted PAVEMENT CAMPAIGN including a PETITION. (5 businesses, 25 residents or the CC itself can cause a petition to be heard by the petitions committee of Stirling Council) was proposed and the CC unanimously agreed a two-pronged attack - the Community Council submitting a petition and organise another for residents at large.

We had a further presentation from **SCOTTISH WATER** on their generation proposal. Site access remains a concern. They will provide a detailed piece for the next BVB.

A new Chairperson will be appointed at next Board meeting. There followed a vote of thanks to Gordon (along with Lorna Ash & Sue Graves).
