

More Houses for Campsie Road?

Community View — There were prolonged consultations leading to our Community Action Plan (2011) and successive rounds of discussion on subsequent Local Development Plan proposals for our villages. The community agreed that the Cala Development on Campsie Road would be LAST development in this location with the boundary with the Green Belt being created by a new cemetery provided by Stirling Council. This has been backed by the Council and is consistent with the conclusions reached by the Reporter who examined the Local Development Plan —"Further low density westerly expansion would have an unacceptable impact on the countryside and Green Belt".

New Housing Proposals — Strathblane Community Council and Stirling Council have now received a "pre application notice" (PAN) from Gladman Developments. The PAN is an initial stage aimed at helping developers, the community and other interested parties to iron out any issues before the potential submission of a formal planning application. A PAN is required for major developments that may be housing proposals of 50 or more dwellings or housing sites of 2 hectares or more. This PAN is suggesting the creation of a residential development and a cemetery. The site on the eastern periphery of Strathblane adjacent to the new Cala houses covers two fields that are divided by a track leading over the Blane Water and the Strathkelvin Railway Path.

Consultation The PAN is the start of a 3 month consultation between the applicant and the community. Gladman Developments are holding a **Drop-in Ssession** at the Village Club on **Monday 31st October from 3-7pm**.

It is vital that as many people as possible go along to find out what the development proposals are and that you express your views on what is being proposed.

Gladman Developments will have to produce a pre-application consultation report in which the views of those who 'drop in' on October 31st will be reported to the Council.

Will our cash-strapped Council change its mind if they are offered a "free" cemetery?

Reporting Faults — The Community Council is pleased to be alerted to problems which community members discover with public services and facilities. It allows us to take them up with our 'planning partners' -Stirling Council, Health Board, Police etc.. October Community Council Update from Chair, Margaret Vass

It was great to see attendance at our CC was back to the usual good attendance by residents. We are aware that the school does not have the best acoustics and that it is not always easy to hear what is being said. We are looking at permanently moving to the Village Club where we also have access to wifi.

Health and Social Care: Marian reported that Larbert now has a discharge lounge to free up beds more quickly to allow patients to wait for medication and their lift home. There is also a rapid access clinic for elderly patients where multiple tests can be carried out in one day for speedier diagnosis. The ambulance service is currently recruiting more paramedics. Emergencies will go to the nearest hospital but non emergencies will be taken to Larbert.

Roads took up a lot of our discussion with Gordon Mac-Lachlan telling us about arrangements for the road closure. Once again it was clear that working in silos is alive and well in roads as he was unable to tell us about arrangements for buses during the closure as that was another persons responsibility. We stressed the importance of getting diversion signage correct and trying to avoid Old Mugdock Road being used as a rat run. The importance of clearing gullies before the road closure was stressed to stop water streaming across the new surface. The top of Kirkhouse Road will be resurfaced in November. We are still waiting to hear about the traffic calming measures on Campsie Road, when the anti slip surface will be applied

The next SCC meeting is at 7.30pm on **Monday November 7th** in the Primary School.

It is really important that residents report problems as if there are lots of complaints we are more likely to have them improved.

Broadband is still a regular topic. Residents are reminded to check out the reports on Killearn CC website which contain information about our area. We also understand that Virgin are considering installing cable for the village and BT are exploring ways to enhance broadband for the Scout camp which could have benefits for our outlying areas. Cllr Graham Lambie was asked to investigate the very poor broadband at the library which is preventing computer classes being held at the library.

Community Council Elections — We hope to have a full Community Council of 12 members after the elections.

A **Community Partnership event** was held at Balfron High on 20th September. Pupils were able to hear about local volunteering opportunities. We are yet to see if this approach to young people bears fruit.

After-School Buses from Balfron High School

An emerging issue which will feature at our November meeting is the apparent decision by Stirling Council, taken without consultation, to start charging pupils who use buses for journeys home following after-school activities. We will be taking this up with Stirling Council, along with neighbouring Community Councils, including Balfron and Killearn..
