Working in Partnership A Great Opportunity

SCC Chair Margaret Vass makes a call for both the creation of new links between village groups themselves and for new volunteers to come forward.

Along with others I have been posting on Facebook about the opportunity to tap into the increased public engagement of the last few weeks to continue to build and strengthen our community. As Stirling Council have recognised, activity in our villages has been impressive. We have always had a solid core of people actively running groups. But in a small community that core needs to be continuously refreshed. Recently new volunteers have been emerging but we can never have too many. So now, as much as ever, need more community members to consider making a voluntary contribution.

We would like the community to celebrate all the wonderful work that goes on in the village and for individuals and groups to be able to learn from each other's experiences. We therefore intend to produce a special colour BVB featuring all of the groups in our community. Most significantly, we plan to organise a community gathering of representatives from all groups in the village to stimulate discussion on what more might be achieved on key priorities that we identify if we can support and learn from each other. This is likely to to take place at the end of October/beginning of November.

How can we discuss our priorities, improve communications and mutual support and maximise funding opportunities for the community? The Community Council September Update

We feel that we have been marking time a bit waiting for the Priority Based Budgeting to start. It is now confirmed that community meetings are at 7pm on :

7th October—Stirling High 20th October—Balfron Campus 27th October—Killin Primary 30th October—McLaren High 11th November—Wallace High

Remember many of you didn't believe us last year! So please go along to any one of these meetings if you value your bin collection service or music in schools. The purpose of the meetings is for you to find out what is being proposed, make comment and or suggest other ways of saving money.

Community Policing: Sgt Adrian Robertson attended to highlight what is going on in our area which thankfully is very little just now. He urged the community to report anything suspicious by phoning 101. We yet again raised our concerns about the loss of a "well kent face" around the village.

At our last meeting concern had been raised about the issue of the **lack of district nurses** with the GP practice. Our nurses are attached to the Killearn practice and attend Strathblane 2 days per week. This is based on the number of patients on the practice list. The practice was pleased that the matter had been raised at a public meeting. More patients = more district nurse cover. Palliative care cover is handled by team leader Helen Gray who can be contacted on 550554.

The **road closure** was discussed ranging from the lack of consultation about the 24 hour closure, the lack of information for those directly affected, the inconvenience for people going to and from work and the loss of takings from the businesses directly affected. It was quite pleasant walking around on the quiet road why didn't people use our local shops and pub? The closure was made worse by the other closures close by and no distinction made as to which diversion was being signposted. Some tourists must have been in quite a spin!!

Thank you to everyone who made suggestions for the name for the new road off Campsie Road. We have given the council 3 choices, Campsie Crescent, Dunglass Crescent or the "original name of the field" crescent if that can be established. It has now emerged that Stirling Council does not like a name name being used for more than one street—so Campsie and Dunglass are out and the search goes on.

Points raised under **community issues** included the tall hedge masking the lights at the puffin crossing, hedge cutting beside the A81 and the deterioration of the path at Danny's Brae.

We have also asked Cllr Lambie to request that the CC has representation on **Mugdock Country Park Management Committee**.

October Community Council Meeting

The SCC meets on Monday October 6th at 7.30pm in the Primary School. Stewart Smolarek of Scottish Water will update us on the Turbine Project and PBB will be on the agenda.

Smartwater Project

Strathblane and Killearn are among 6 areas chosen by Police Scotland to pilot the Smartwater product across Scotland. Killearn will host the official Scottish National Media launch on Monday 29 September.

Under the scheme Police will provide 'Smartwater' property marking kits free of charge to some householders in the Strathblane and Killearn communities in areas which analysis suggests are attractive to housebreakers.

Smartwater is a liquid used to mark items of property (mobile phones; computers; jewellery etc)—invisible once dry but visible under the correct Ultraviolet light. The chemical will contain a unique marker registered to the user and can help to reunite recovered property with its owner. The scheme also provides signs displayed on main road routes around the community to let potential criminals know that the product is in use. Other communities where the scheme is operated have experienced a dramatic reduction in crime.

Our local police officers will be out and about in the evenings for the week after the launch visiting identified households with the Smartwater product.

We are very hopeful that the Community Council will be able to negotiate a special offer for householders whose homes have not been included in the free trial. The current annual charge is around £60 per house. check out the website <u>http://www.smartwater.com</u> to find out more. We would also expect this product may reduce insurance premiums.

After extensive press coverage, including The Herald, the Daily Mail, the Bearsden & Milngavie Herald and the Stirling Observer, orders have been flooding in for the book, which tells the life stories of the 27 men from our community who were killed in the First World War and who feature on Strathblane War Memorial. Published under the auspices of SCDT all proceeds from the book will go to Erskine, which has been caring for Scotland's veterans since 1916.

The Strathblanefield Bike Track

Guy Keating writes—The CDT is delighted to announce the village now has a fantastic new facility — a bespoke bike 'pump' track for all kids (big and small...) to use and enjoy.

Several months ago, SCDT applied for a UK Big Lottery Fund grant (via SportScotland), secured the funds to purchase the track and features such as ramps and tabletops, and commissioned an experienced contractor to start the build. Measuring approx. 16 x 10m the weatherproof wooden track is a fully modular loop, with rollers and berms designed to develop bike skills and fitness.

Stirling Council's open access policy to school grounds, means the track can reside in the primary school every summer break and other holiday periods. For the next month or so, it will be located between the zip wire & the football pitch - after which it will go into winter storage to ensure longevity.

Once riders become familiar with the loop, berms and rollers, the idea is to get around without peddling - by 'pumping' the bike down the rollers and using momentum / gravity to zip around. Some obvious pointers for parents;—

1. If 2 or more bikes are on the track at once, 1 direction only.

2. Helmets are essential for riders. No helmet = no ride.

3. The track has a grippy surface and can be ridden when it's damp - probably best not to ride if the track is soaked.

4. You (and your children) use the track at your own risk. Any bike-based activity is self evidentially hazardous and the CDT accepts no liability for any injury or damages occurring as a result of riding on the track.
