Justice for the Blanefield 13 at former Blanefield Printworks site!

SCC Chair, Margaret Vass writes: The total cost of remediating the gardens of the 13 affected homes is £600,000. It represents up to 50% of the value of some of the homes! Half the cost is tax either VAT or Landfill Tax. This is just crazy!

The contaminants are lead and arsenic. The current advice is for residents to stop young children playing in the soil and to wash their hands if they have been in the garden. Don't we all do that! Is it reasonable or proportionate to spend £600,000 to eliminate this so called problem? Three generations have been brought up in the area without any apparent health issues.

We are working closely with Bruce Crawford and Anne McGuire and have asked the UK minister responsible for landfill tax (Sajid Javid) to waive the tax in these circumstances. Paul Wheelhouse is the minister responsible at Holyrood. Both have said it is Stirling Council's responsibility! The council has allocated £125,000 from their budget. Its block grant now includes money to deal with contamination, previously the Scottish Government held the budget. Landfill tax revenue will be devolved to the Scottish government in 2015.

This appalling injustice needs to move up the political agenda while the affected residents still work with the Council to have their problems fixed. We have worked well with the Council so far; now our issue is with both Governments to give the Council some further assistance.

What do we want?

- the garden ground remediated at no cost to NO FAULT OWNERS. This means the Scottish Government giving more money to Stirling Council while amending the legislation is considered;
- legislation changed to deal with the case of no fault owners in the spirit of natural justice to prevent this happening to others;
- the plight of our residents to be featured regularly in the media to get the issue at the top of the political agenda;
- justice for no fault residential owners offered nothing while the public perception is that industrial sites whose former owners have gone out of business are cleaned up at governments' expense.

We have some very able people within our community. We need those of you with political connections and good contacts and networks to talk about what is happening in our village at every possible opportunity. And, if other approaches fail, we need people who are prepared to campaign to get this issue onto Alex Salmond's and David Cameron's desks.

We are preparing a briefing pack which will be available on the village website to help people understand the predicament that our friends and neighbours find themselves in through no fault of their own. They are facing a life changing situation and need our help.

The Community Council in August

Here we focus on the major issues discussed at the August meeting the full minute is available as usual on the website and the village noticeboards.

Apart from the 'regular' items on **road improvements** (the A81 will be closed at Duntreath for the week beginning September 2nd) and **dog fouling** (a campaign to be announced in September) the August meeting focus on two major issues for the community.

Community Campaign on Injustice of Contaminated Land Legislation

The Community Council agreed to give the strongest backing and to help mobilise the whole community in support of a campaign to get justice for the 13 households facing huge remediation costs and to get a change in the legislation that puts them in this position. It was agreed that, first, a conciliatory approach should be tried testing our faith in the political system to sort issues out when there seems to be an impasse.

Alf Young, an independent concerned local resident, has offered to chair a meeting with Anne McGuire MP, Bruce Crawford MSP, senior Stirling councillors, local councillors and community representatives. The object of that meeting will be to find a way to bring about natural justice for the 13 residents and bury party politics.

There was palpable anger and bewilderment among CC members and the public present. How stupid can legislation be which should provide benefit to blighted communities instead punishes them! "This is an extraordinary injustice and is absolutely ludicrous".

Fiona Murray on behalf of the affected residents stated that they were all very grateful for the CC input and involvement in a stressful situation with no end yet in sight. In the end of course, the 13 residents will have to make the decision on how they want the matter dealt with and how to proceed. (For fuller coverage see page 1)

Community Involvement with Campsie Road Housing Site & Old Peoples 'Bungalows

Tony Teasdale, Director Rural Stirling Housing Association and Steve Mason, Stirling Council Housing Dept. to update us on this development and other housing issues.

The Local Development Plan will be finalised by the end of the year and, as it stands, would require 50% of the units on this site - which may be developed by Cala Homes — to be affordable housing. The 50% is, however, not yet 'set in stone'. If Strathblane was given priority in the allocation of the limited Stirling Council funds available Rural Stirling Housing Association could engage in the construction of those houses. With a seller of land and a developer keen to move there was optimism that Strathblane might gain such priority and, in response to Tony Teasdale's proposal, a group made up of community councillors and at least one local resident was formed to ensure a continuing local input into the development. In discussion a range of points were raised - from footpath and roads implications to the nature of the tenure of the affordable houses.

The Community Council would encourage people who might be interested in renting a home in the Campsie Road site to apply to RSHA (01786 841101) and Stirling Council. This will help assess needs and sizes required.

With funding at present for local authority social and affordable housing is running at £1.5 million per annum. and a stated desire to build **bungalows suitable for older people** Stirling Council also want to hear about any suitable plots of land in the villages and will respond positively - particularly where there is local enthusiasm.

Greenheart — Play Park Update

A recent grant application to the Big Lottery Communities and Families Fund has been successful in securing £10,000 to purchase play equipment for the younger age range (0-8 years) and to hold a community event. Orders have now been placed to purchase a mini climbing frame with slide; two springer mobiles; a wooden train set engine and carriages; a set of five balance beams; and a storyteller's chair. Stirling Council will install the equipment, and all being well, these should be in place by the end of September/early October. Weather permitting there will then be an opening event.

A grant application has also been made to Stirling Council's Community Pride Fund for additional public seating and a third picnic bench set.

Path Development Group

Our two current funded projects are moving towards completion this month. Thanks to the leadership of Calum Craig and the enthusiastic efforts of over twenty volunteers the basic work Paths for All project to upgrade the path from the bridge at Park Place to the playpark and Library is now complete. It has been an important learning exercise for the Path Maintenance Group and we are keen to get more feedback from members of the community on the end result. (email: cc@strathblanefield.org.uk)

The Group now has the consultant's draft report on the Railway Path Feasibility Study and in a few weeks will be in a position to move to the important next stage of raising funds to construct the path.

BROADBAND ADVISORY GROUP—The Scottish Government recently announced a contract with BT for Next Generation Broadband. The aim is to connect 85% of Scottish premises by 2015, and 95% by 2017 to the high speed fibre network. Stirling Council have agreed to supplement the central funding and have set up a Broadband Advisory Group (BAG) to provide a local perspective. By the autumn BT should have completed a detailed survey of local exchanges and connections. Meanwhile, the BAG is interested in hearing about the level of broadband connectivity you get, and any issues you have. Doug Ashworth is a Killearn based Public Representative on the BAG.
