Playing Your Part in Our Community's Resilience

How good is your memory? Don't recall what you had for dinner last Thursday? Do remember who pushed you off a swing when aged eight? Apologies if what you are about to read is vaguely familiar. It is very similar to a piece published in the BVB in August 2014. And it is asking the same questions. We, that is your Community Council are in the process of revising the village Emergency Plan. We wish to know what physical and human resources can be called on in the unlikely event of a emergency Incident being declared.

Some Background- First a brief resume on the background. Following two severe winters in 2009/10 and 2010/11, Stirling Council hosted a conference on how to improve the resilience of our communities in the event of exceptional weather or other extreme events. As a result Stirling Council recommended that all communities develop a local Emergency Plan. As part of this process, in 2013, SCC was supplied with 40 Hi-Viz vests and a set of snow shovels for use in an emergency. Following on from that in the spring of 2014 communities were supplied with an Emergency Resilience Kit, containing a multi-purpose outdoor radio, a12km range walkie talkie, 10 LED Dyno Torches, 10 Foil Blankets, 10 pairs of snow/ice shoe grips and a small first aid kit.

Revising the Emergency Plan — We are now almost three years on from the last time the Plan was revised. This is not just checking what contact person has changed and confirming their details. It is about ensuring the viability of the Plan in the unlikely event of an extreme set of circumstances. None of us has a crystal ball, but your community council and Stirling Council would like to be prepared, and to ensure that YOU have the necessary awareness to participate if you are able.

Part of our preparation is for SCC have a register of human and equipment resources that could be made available for the benefit of the community should the need arise to activate our Community **Emergency** Plan.

A list of the skill sets and types of equipment that have been identified so far in this exercise is provided in the box on the right.

This is not an exhaustive list. SCC will be happy to receive any further suggestions.

February Community Council Update from Chair, Margaret Vass

Action Since January meeting - In *Matters Arising* it was reported that refuse collection has been getting better; action in the form of white lining has been taken on Campsie Road; and Stirling Council will consider the issues relating to parking on Old Mugdock Road in March

Gladman Consultation — It was reported that SCC Chair and Planning Correspondent have met with Mark Richardson who manages Connell Estates property interests and had a good exchange of views. Gladdman and the landowner are currently assessing the feedback from their community consultation exercise.

Other Planning Matters— Focus on the planning front was on two items, one specific and the other more general. First it was reported that Strathblane Country House Hotel has dropped its application from four flats to three—although it was noted that there remained the possibility of sub-dividing to end up with four. More generally, concern is growing over the accumulation of housing applications in the Old Mugdock Road/ Moor Road area because of the increasing volume of traffic on an already overloaded and, in places, dangerous road. It was agreed to make further comments to SC on Old Mugdock Rd and relate them to the comments in the LDP.

Community Resilience —local Emergency Plans established in 2014 are now in process of updated and Willie Oswald has taken the lead role for SCC in that task. See his piece on Page 1. **Dementia Day Funding** - Money left from Test Site funding, currently held by the Church, is available for local groups to apply for. There is about £1000 remaining. It is up to each organisation to use the money how they can. This is a one off grant, once it's gone, it's gone.

Social Care — a number of d evelopments relating to the care of the elderly were reported on, some involving pupils here and in Balfron High School.
