Action to Improve Community Facilities — the Next Phase

Planning our Community Facilities

After extensive community consultation in 2011 the Community Council and the Community Development Trust agreed a Community Action Plan (CAP). Priorities were set, regularly reviewed and pursued by both bodies.

In February 2015 with the support of Stirling Council we held a highly successful Community Summit involving representatives from all the main organisation in the villages which after further consultation lead to an updating of our priorities focussing on the school and library as facilities requiring urgent upgrading.

This year Stirling Council, using the resources of **Hubco** (a joint partnership between public and private sector organisations aimed at developing and delivering better local services), and with the participation of SCC, SCDT Parent Council, School and library staff and community members representing the main community assets have been involved in a feasibility study mapping what we have, what we might want and how additional facilities might be achieved. We now have the Hubco Report. Here, in summary, are some of the elements:

Community Assets

- —**Education -** Primary School (P1-P7) with 173 pupils; Early Years Provision during School Hours; High School in Balfron-Out of School Provision - Not-for-profit organisation, all year round, for 4 1/2 to 16 yr olds — 128 for breakfast, 136 after school.
- —**GP Services -** Privately run GP practice.
- —Sport and Leisure Private facilities in Milngavie; Council facilities at BHS. Tennis & Bowling Clubs have

solid membership but struggle for new members. Football team has good participation levels but a pitch with drainage issues.

- —Library Services traditional library services (books & electronic). Well used by community & school.
- —Community Buildings A variety of competing venues, notably the Village Club & Edmonstone Hall in varying condition. Scout Hall in poor condition with no plans for investment; Parish Church and St Kessogs provide community resources - including the Kirk Rooms. There are problems of finding volunteers to run facilities.

What we Need (or Might Wish For)

A new Library building; more flexible teaching & learning spaces in the school; an increase in Early Years provision; a new location for Out of School provision; Indoor Sports Facilities - for school & community; a large community function & performance venue; a business hub; — and parking remains an issue.

Problems for Delivering New Facilities

Existing local organisations are all struggling for funding to improve what is offered and Stirling Council funding is likely to be limited to a new Library and Early Years provision with some improvements in school condition.

Further Consultation Process

Hubco costed the options and as a community, lead by the SCDT (see box below), we must search for ways to resource what we need. But first there must be a major community consultation process to reassess our priorities.

In the coming months SCC will lead that process.

New Group for Community Development Trust

The Community Property Assets Group, formed earlier this year and chaired by Alastair Balfour (who has been co-opted as an SCDT Director) has become part of the Trust.

Initially the Group's main aim is to investigate possible new sources of funding and support, from government and elsewhere, for the development of facilities within our community.

October Community Council Update from Margaret Vass

Edenmill Plans — Our meeting began with an interesting presentation from Mark Gibson of Edenmill Farm. He was keen to give us an idea of his expansion plans to respond to the tourism opportunities around the John Muir Way and the success of the Christmas Tree business prior to any Planning Applications were made.

Double Yellow Lines — to ensure access for emergency vehicles double yellow lines have been agreed both for Old Mugdock Road at the Coop and at the War Memorial at **Campsie Dene Road**. They should be in place soon.

Community Resilience Plan — Willie Oswald has been working hard to update our Community Resilience Plan. More of you have been in touch with offers of help following last month's Bulletin feature. Thank you to everyone who has offered their services of resources.. We are hoping that our emergency hub will be the Village Club with the necessary communication requirements and storage.

One-way Priority for the Station Road Bridge — Much of the meeting was taken up with debating the Station Road bridge proposals which are designed to help complete the safe walking (and cycling) route between Blanefield and Strathblane along the disused railway line. It is hoped that an added benefit would be a slowing traffic traffic along the road. A set of useful comments have come from community members before, during and since the meeting. While welcoming the proposal there is a real concern that priority being given to traffic coming into the village will fail to reduce speeds and may cause gridlock. We have agreed to meet with Council Officers to see what can be changed.

Community Rights in the Planning Process — We have previously commented on changes to Planning Legislation. Indeed every time legislation has been

reviewed we have asked the Government to give communities the right to appeal decisions so that we have equal rights with developers. We agreed to support *Planning Democracy's* campaign for equal rights of appeal which would giving communities' views equal weight in the planning process at every level.

Stirling Council's Scheme for Community Councils Our Councillor advised that Stirling Council had agreed at a special meeting to review the scheme for Community Councils. While we have no difficulty with this we have a real concern about the lack of consultation — and then no communication of this proposal.
