## **Gladman Application Refused**

# Councillors uphold LDP & protect Green Belt land from residential development

We print below the Stirling Council Press Release issued on November 8th after last Thursday's Planning & Regulation Panel at which Gladman's application was refused on a motion proposed by Cllr graham Lambie and seconded by Cllr Alistair Berrill.

"Stirling Council's Planning and Regulation Panel has protected green belt land in Strathblane by refusing plans to build 70 homes and a new cemetery.

The development was proposed for land south of Broadgate House on Campsie Road, and was being taken forward by Gladman Developments, which is part of the multi-million pound Gladman Group.

Today Councillors unanimously rejected the plans, agreeing with Planning Officers concerns that the development would negatively impact the area's protected green belt area. They also felt it would not protect the historic environment by encroaching on the focal point of the Broadgate Mound. The proposals were also not consistent with the Council's Local Development Plan and policy.

The Council received over 80 objections to the plans which included concerns about the impact the development could have on local services and infrastructure.

Planning and Regulation Panel Chair Alasdair MacPherson commented: "Councillors unanimously agreed that the plans proposed were simply inappropriate for the Broadgate site. Not only would this development have significantly impacted our green belt area, it would have also been detrimental to the historical site of the Broadgate Mound which must be protected. Building new properties, particularly affordable homes, is one of our top priorities but we must make sure that these developments are also right for local communities and the Stirling area."

A public consultation, including a public event at the Strathblane Village Club took place in 2016. The proposals were presented to the Panel as the application was classed as a 'Major' development as defined in the Town and Country Planning (Hierarchy of Development) (Scotland) Regulations 2009."

We do not expect Gladman to give up at this stage.

### November Community Council Update from Margaret Vass

Scottish Power Networks and their contractor attended our meeting to apologise for the damage done to the Scottish Water bridge and railings at the bottom of the Ash Track. This was as a result of felling an old electricity pole that was so rotten that the ropes that were attached were unable to protect the railings. We have been assured that everything will be fully repaired and will be restored as new.

This month's **Police Report** covered three main issues. First, vehicles are still being damaged outside the Coop. Second, sheep worrying has been taking place at the top of Old Mugdock Rd near Moor Road resulting in the very painful death of a sheep—dogs MUST be under control, preferably on a lead when amongst livestock. And, third, it was reported that the remarkable number of 60 drivers have been caught speeding at Campsie Road in the last two months!

On the subject of **speeding** we decided to step up our campaign to put pressure on Stirling Council to come up with proposals to cut the speed of traffic through the village.

**Planning** — Our horizons are important! we need to be more vigilant about changes to the skyline when considering planning applications. Lessons have been learnt the hard way, our skyline is changing with the construction of a large house in the grounds of Aros House off Moor Road. We agreed to oppose an application for a new two storey house at The Retreat off Cuilt Brae because of its impact on the horizon.


