# Snow Emergency! What Community Spirit! You Were Brilliant!

After the last snow and ice emergency in 2010 SCC worked in partnership with Stirling Council to examine what went wrong and how responses could be improved. We pioneered local resilience plans and have regularly asked for contact details of people willing to help.

**The Resilience Plan** — The plan itself is pretty bureaucratic and takes no account of social media so we will be pioneering a different approach after this recent experience! Basically the Council deals with keeping the roads in and out of the villages open based on priority 1, 2 and 3 routes. They also ensure that vulnerable people receiving Council services still receive them.

As we know the unprecedented conditions meant they struggled with priority 1 let alone 2, even though the Council brought in farmers to help clear roads there was just way too much snow.

We triggered our resilience plan on the 28th February and that gave us vastly improved communication with the Council than we have ever had before both with the resilience officers and senior managers.

**The Role of Social Media** — Using the Strathblanefield Facebook page we mobilised the community and your response was amazing, checking your neighbours, offering first aid, 4x4s, of course clearing the residential priority 3 roads that the Council was never going to reach and clearing around the school to ensure it reopened. Our Facebook page really came into its own allowing us to spot issues, raise them with the Council and feedback responses.

**Thanks all round** — It is always hard to highlight individuals when there were so many of great stories of assistance. However I will single out Andy McGregor, Annabel Sharp and Mike McNulty for special mention. Thank you. Also thanks to the local farmers and those with JCBs who turned out to help. We know everything wasn't perfect and there is never enough grit and some grit bins had been removed and bins weren't emptied. The priority was to unblock all the local roads first and that wasn't completed until Tuesday 6th March. It was longer for some other communities. To receive a thank you from the Stewart Carruth, the Council's CEO was a great recognition of all that our community achieved.

We Need Your Help Again! — There is a new source of funding for community projects and both the Community Council and Strathblane Community Development Trust have made bids for projects at short notice given the snow emergency. If anyone fancies a trip to Callander Primary School on Saturday morning 24th March from 10 until 2 we need your votes.

The new system means that Community members from the age of 10 who go along to the meeting will hear a 2 minute presentation on each project then vote on who receives funding.

So it could be a family outing. Lunch will be provided. The Community Council have submitted an ambitious bid of £10,000 to create a sensory garden to tidy up the derelict land behind the closed public toilets.

We have consulted the community before in the BVB about the best use of this land and gardens/orchards have featured in your responses. Not only do we need you to go along and vote but we will need a group to help implement the project too.

# March Community Council Update From: Chair Margaret Vass

**Snow Emergency** — A considerable part of our meeting was reviewing the snow emergency as highlighted on the front page. We agreed to ask for a debriefing session with Stirling Council.

**Police Report** — The police report again raised the issue of anti social behaviour in the park and at the school. Local young people seem to be attracting others from out of the area to join them. Work is taking place with the Balfron High School Based Officer to resolve this. If you have teenagers do you know what they are doing on Friday and Saturday nights?

Housebreaking still continues in the area and we are asked to report anything suspicious. The traffic division had marked and unmarked cars operating in our area over a weekend. Road checks identified a number of offences.

We also asked for more care to be taken when road closures due to traffic accidents require diversions — making it clear that Old Mugdock Road is not suitable route.

**Flooding** — The CC is currently pursuing flooding issues at Jenny's Burn, Station Rd and at Stockiemuir Road where the giant potholes were.

**Road Safety** — We are still pursuing the road safety campaign started by P5 but the recent snow has delayed action by Stirling Council. Concern was raised at the speed vehicles were driven in the villages during the snow emergency when pedestrians including children had no alternative but to walk on the road

**Road Maintenance** — We agreed to use the new Community Empowerment Legislation and submit a "participation request" to have a say and work in partnership with Stirling Council to improve road maintenance. The basis for our request will be

"Strathblane and Blanefield have expectations for well maintained roads, pavements and road infrastructure with the reality of finite Council resources. We wish to enhance the safety of both pedestrians and drivers and work together to deliver this."

We will keep you informed of progress.

**River Bank Repairs** — We are also raising the lack of action to repair the river bank at the King George V playing fields. Please ask your children not to climb through the fences at either side of the river. The bank is dangerous.

**Your Place, Your Priorities Application** — Finally, as mentioned on page 1, we agreed to form a subcommittee to apply for funding from the new funding stream Your Place your Priorities.
