PARKING ISSUES

A number of residents have asked us to raise the issue of inconsiderate parking again!

The area round the Coop can still be a nightmare and the CC is pursuing the Coop and Stirling Council to find ways of alleviating the problems. Part of the solution - especially in the kind of weather we have had recently - might be to walk or cycle to the shop. If you do have to take a vehicle, please remember that people live next to the Coop and should be able to park near their homes.

Milndavie Crescent is constantly brought to our attention and recently featured on the village Facebook page. Please consider your neighbours when parking here. If a number of residents think it might be useful the Community Council would be happy to host a meeting to help find a way forward.

Parking around the school at opening and closing times continues to create dangers for children and great inconvenience to others. At 3pm the Library carpark commonly overflows on to the roadway (and footway) in Kirkburn Drive. (The photos show some of the 36 cars parked around the school at 3pm on a dry day in November) The Parent Council is on the case and is surveying parents to find the best way to resolve the issue. The CC (and the Path Development Group) are keen to do what we can to help.

Our much missed ex-Community PC, David McNally, often pointed out that driving onto a footway is a road traffic offence. No-one is looking for prosecutions, just **proper consideration for pedestrians**. Remember parking in the road helps slow down traffic.

Both the SCC and the Development Trust have unanimously backed the proposal that Strathblane & Blanefield should join the national *Walkers are Welcome* scheme. We are already seeing an increase in walkers through the village because of the opening of the John Muir Way — Strathblane is the only point this cross country path hits Stirlingshire—and that will increase as the route becomes more established.

The main community benefits would come in attracting more custom for local businesses (and perhaps for new businesses— B & B?), in making it easier for the community both to attract funding to maintain and improve the local paths network and helping the Community Council campaign to improve bus services.

The area already fulfils the main criteria to qualify but we will do at least 5% of community members to register support. So please sign up on the sheets available in the Library and in general circulation.

Community Council April Update

from SCC Chair Margaret Vass

April's was another busy meeting, well attended by residents. We are unusual amongst CCs in having a set of regular attendees and although the BVB gives us accountability to the community we would be delighted if more people came along to the meetings. This meeting was typical in covering a range of issues of importance to the whole community.

Some **serious concerns were raised**. It is hard to believe that valued medical staff are being abused and local medical services put in jeopardy. Such **abuse and threatening anonymous letters** are completely unacceptable. If anyone has an issue there is a formal way to have it dealt with. Real worries were also raised about **vandalism and underage drinking** in the school playground and playing field area. Broken glass has been regularly collected and concerns were expressed over the longer-term effects on children who get into trouble with the police. Building dens may be a part of growing up, but it is not acceptable to leave tents, pillows, cans and bottles for others to clear up.

More positively we agreed to back an application to join the *Walkers are Welcome* scheme; and were pleased to hear that **Cala will start work on the Campsie Rd housing site** around April 27th. The affordable housing is due to start in the late summer. If you are interested in renting a house make sure that your name is on BOTH Rural Stirling HA and Stirling Council lists. We heard from Cllr Muirhead that **the 'missing link' on the A81 will be resurfaced** sometime this year. We will then push for both entrances to the village to be done next year. resurfacing will also happen on the A81 at Douchlage Lodge and on the B821 at Carbeth Loch. **Fast Broadband** will arrive later this year — it is important that you register an interest in it with BT.

The **petition for road safety measures on the Stockiemuir Road** around the junction with the Cuilt Road will be submitted to Stirling Council this week—thanks to 79 signatories (we could've got more but the requirement was only 25). We are working on actions which emerged from the Village Summit and in the next BVB will consult on whether the Community Action Plan priorities remain the right ones and whether there is a consensus for others to be added.

Greenheart— The latest phase of the play-park has been completed with the installation of a circular tree seat. The seat, which forms a most attractive addition to the park has been manufactured by Stirling Council.

Pump Track— The pump track has now been set up again for the summer season in the play-park.

Bothy— A site meeting has taken place and, once conveyancing has been completed, consultation will take place on a final layout for the building and its environs. That will be followed by the necessary planning and building warrant applications.

Community Football Club— Using some of the surpluses from the sales of the paths leaflet and the Now and Then book SCDT have provided funding for equipment — including balls, goals and nets for the Community Football Club.

Walkers are Welcome — along with the SCC SCDT has backed the idea of applying for accreditation for our community in the *Walkers are Welcome* scheme (see P. 1).

The SCDT Annual General Meeting

will be held on Tuesday June 2nd at 7pm in the Village Club. All members are invited.

Path Development Group — reports some progress since the March issue:

— We have now received an additional grant—from the Asda Plastic bag Community Fund—towards the cost of a feasibility study for the repair of **Danny's Brae**, and we should be able to go ahead with the study in the next month.

— We are still awaiting the formal go-ahead from the Scottish Water Legal Department for the new **Link Path** from the railway track to the Gowk Stane Road. Our target is still to complete the path by the summer, and Scottish Natural Heritage are keen to make it a part of the John Muir Way.

The **Scary Path Video** is complete and should soon be available on the Paths for All website and on Youtube!

'A Village Remembers'— All the research material, photographs, related articles, books, diaries, CDs & spreadsheets with information about the 27 men on the War Memorial, have now been placed in Strathblane library for reference. Lynne James can arrange access to the material.
