## **Marian Lever**

Marian was a gentle, caring but determined lady with a considerable intellect and a passion for education in all its forms.Family always came first for Marion and it would be fair to say that she never really recovered following the death of her beloved Bill nearly 4 years ago. Her much loved children and grandchildren helped to fill the void as did her work with the Community Council.

Marian moved to the village in 1972 and brought up her family here. She was involved in many organisations at that time and many will remember her as Tufty lady helping children learn how to cross the road. Watching tennis was an obsession, especially seeing Andy Murray triumph and of course there was the Davis Cup. She joined the Community Council in March 2010 and was an active member, finding her niche when she took the lead for health and well-being.



Marian organised the first heart start course held in the school and was key to having our first defibrillator installed at the Edmonstone Hall on the 25th November 2013 with the assistance of Trossachs Search and Rescue and a donation from the Hodgkinson family.

Marian's voice was heard loud and clear as she strove for improved care and support services for the SW Rural Stirling Area. She was incensed to hear that the Strathendrick Home at Balfron was to be closed with no local consultation, to help fund centralised care in Stirling, and spearheaded the successful campaign to keep it open. Marian always preferred working in partnership rather than opposition and attended many meetings to understand the bureaucracy of health and social care, and was a keen advocate of the new "neighbourhoods of care" approach to delivering support to enable people to remain at home. Recently however she had become very suspicious of what was going on around Strathendrick and was about to get back into campaign mode to ensure that this area is well served without the need to travel long distances.

Marian was also passionate about our residents being able to choose where to go for health care: Glasgow or Forth Valley. Four years ago our right to choose was confirmed by the then health minister. More recently that assurance started to slip with local residents being given no choice. Determined to fix this, Marion helped convene a meeting with the two health boards and the ambulance service, and our choice was confirmed yet again. Sadly this is unfinished business, with the Ambulance service due to speak at the December Community Council meeting.

Marian's tenure as Chair of Strathblane Community Council was far too short. She will be remembered for giving encouragement and support to her colleagues, her patience when the clock was ticking at a lengthy meeting, but above all for her commitment to this community. She will be greatly missed but her work will continue.

#### **Housing Fair**

#### **Progress on The Library Project**

SCDT held a successful Housing Fair at the Village Club last month, in association with Rural Housing Scotland, Stirling Council, Rural Stirling Housing Association and architects Austin-Smith:Lord. The objective was to launch the village's Housing Needs Survey, presently being carried out by Rural Housing Scotland on behalf of SCDT. All residents are invited to complete the survey, copies of which were circulated in last month's BVB and is available at the SCDT website www.strathblane.online until the end of November.

The survey will enable SCDT, working with Strathblane Community Council and Stirling Council, to develop a 10-year Housing Action Plan to deliver the new homes that our community needs.

The Housing Fair featured information stands that provided detail about successful housing developments in other Stirlingshire communities with similar needs to Strathblane and Blanefield – particularly for affordable homes to rent or buy for those who have yet to set foot on the housing ladder. The other need that SCDT anticipates will emerge from the survey is for downsizing accommodation for our more elderly residents, perhaps included supported living space.

Rural Stirling Housing Association chief executive Donna Birrell, Rural Housing Scotland's director Derek Logie and architects Andrew McCafferty and Neil Alexander were on hand to answer residents' questions.

"We were delighted to see so many people attend the Fair," said SCDT chair Margaret Vass. "It's clear that a lot of our residents are thinking hard about their future housing needs. This is a community that lacks a proper mix of housing types for its people, and we hope the Survey will provide a clear sense of direction for us as we look to start work on a major Housing Action Plan. So if you haven't filled in the survey PLEASE DO SO"

The funds are now safely invested with Edinburgh fund managers McInroy and Wood, until they are needed to help pay for the construction of a new community library.

Since the announcement of Mr Graham's wonderful donation, SCDT has met with Stirling Council to discuss a partnership for the development of a vision and a plan for the new library. A working party of council officials and SCDT directors is to be formed to manage the project, which we hope will start within two years once all the approvals are in place.

SCDT is also working with its architects, Glasgow-based firm Austin-Smith:Lord, on a feasibility study for the specification, design and location of the building. This study will investigate potential demand within our village for a business hub facility which would provide accommodation, meeting and support services for people presently running their own enterprises from home: if there is sufficient demand and such a hub would be financially viable, it could be added to the library building to create more of a community complex serving a number of local needs. Full community consultation will be carried out before any plans are finalised.

Further details of this important project will be included in future Bulletins.




