# Station Road Link Path Due in the Spring

In 2014 the SCDT Path Development Group set out to develop a multi-user off-road route joining the Strathblane and the Blanefield ends of our community. A major part of that was achieved in 2016 with the upgrading of the path from Station Road to the entrance to the newly created allotments. That path has been very well used but it left walkers, wheelers and cyclists from Blanefield to navigate the inadequate and, at times dangerous, track along the edge of Station Road to reach the start of the new path.

We are now pleased to say that we are finally in a position to bypass this section by creating a new 'Link Path' through the area of unmaintained woodland starting at the bridge on Station Road to join the new path about 30 metres in from the road. (see plan) The task has not been straightforward. We have gained permission from the landowner, Duntreath Estates and planning permission from Stirling Council for 'change of use'; engaged our long-term project manager, Richard East of City Design Coop to update the feasibility study originally done in 2014 and updated the Habitat Survey which was done at that time. There has been much interchange between ourselves, Stirling Council Roads and Sustrans on the vital details of the



interface between the new path and Station Road at the bridge and we now have an agreed plan. This preparatory and design work was funded by Sustrans Community Links programme.

Funding for the construction phase, which will cost in the region of £80,000 has been gained from Sustrans Places for Everyone programme with important match funding from Clackmannan and Stirling Environmental Trust (CSET) and the Forbes Brown Memorial Trust together with the vital contribution of the narrowing of the bridge and the widening of the path over it by Stirling Council.

We will minimise tree removal, planting trees and landscaping work along the edges of the path. Our main funder, Sustrans, requires that a multi-user path must have a 'bound surface (tarmac) but we plan to add a resin based covering (in a colour more suited to our rural location) to avoid any danger of slippage.

The construction work was put out to tender in December. We have received three good tenders which come within our budget and expect to award the contract this month. The aim is to complete the path together with the installation of signage and some path furniture by April.

At the same time the Group has gained funding from the Coop Community Fund and CSET for the creation and erection of a large Heritage Information Board alongside the Railway Path near the entrance to the new link path. Much of the work will be undertaken by community members led by Keith Vass (erection of boards) and Anne Balfour (Heritage Information Content). Again the target date for completion is April.

#### Strathblane Community Council January Update

From Chair Julie Hutchison

The meeting opened with Julie Hutchison being voted in as temporary Chair and Kate Ramsden as temporary Vice-chair.

PC Graham attended the meeting and reported that the village had been relatively quiet during the festive period. Following yet another break in at Mugdock Country Park car park he reminded residents to put valuables out of sight when leaving their cars.

The proposed holiday pods at the Blane Valley Inn generated discussion with representation from interested parties. The Community Council agreed to write to Stirling Council to ask for clarification on several issues, including parking, drainage, accessibility and supervision when the pub is closed.

Following last month's meeting a date was set for members of the Community Council to meet with Lynne McKinley from Stirling Council to move on the Participation Request where the Community Council will work more closely with Stirling Council on matters that affect the community.

As a result of the discussion in December with members of the Ambulance Service, the original letter from Bruce Crawford that states that residents would have the choice of using Forth Valley or Glasgow hospitals, except in cases of accident when you will be taken to the nearest hospital was forwarded to Pam Campbell who will send it to the Ambulance Service. A question was asked if the NHS 24 service would also follow these guidelines as their advice on cross boundary provision is not consistent. The Community Council will clarify this with Bruce Crawford and report back.

Previous discussions about flooding in the village have resulted in the Flooding Forum proposing to hold a Roadshow. See the article elsewhere in the bulletin.

The elected member reported that the budget has been delayed due to the election and that the meeting will now take place on February 27th. There is likely to be a shortfall in the region of £10 million. There is no information about the future of the Strathendrick Home. Fibre Broadband will reach Auchengillan Scout Camp by March.

The next Community Council meeting will be on February 3rd.

# **Flooding Survey**

Maria Lucey from Stirling Council has contacted the Community Council regarding the recent flooding. Stirling Council has commissioned a flood study of the area, which will investigate the causes of flooding and produce a short list of potential flood mitigation measures. All sources of flooding will be assessed as part of the study and a hydraulic model produced.

A letter has been sent to residents to notify them of topographic and threshold survey works that will take place in the Strathblane and Blanefield area during the week commencing 20th January 2020 as part of the ongoing flooding survey of the area. The results of these surveys will then be used to produce a hydraulic model of the area. This work will be carried out on behalf of Stirling Council by the consultants WSP. The commissioned study is a full flood study and so includes investigative work into all burns, watercourses, discharges and surface water runoff (potentially from fields/the catchment above Strathblane/Blanefield
