One of the village's best-known characters, Derek has still managed to keep some secrets about himself: for example he's been a top Elvis impersonator. And he met The Beatles when they came to Birmingham in 1962, though history does not record whether he cut their famous mops!

In retirement he now has five grandsons to keep him busy – and his scissors still flying.

Welcome from Chair

JH welcomed everybody to the meeting and thanked ,members of the CC who put up `and took down the Christmas lights.

Matters arising

JH read out the reply that we received from Carol Beattie regarding our complaint about lack of information about road closures during roadworks on the A81.

We were successful in obtaining a Community Pride grant for the trees to commemorate the late Queen's jubilee. JH will organise the purchase of 6 cherry trees to be planted at the new library.

The For-sale sign attached to the chevrons on the A81 has been removed.

A resident had asked who cleans the bus shelters. JH spoke to SC and the result was that in fact nobody cleans them.

The bridge that has collapsed on the WHW belongs to Scottish Water. They are making it safe but access to it is part of Duntreath Estates. Scottish Water plans to liaise with Duntreath regarding more permanent repairs and will contact us once they know what is happening.

We are still in discussion with SC regarding funding to hold meetings in the VC. GE has emailed Bookings about this and will also Email Councillor McGarvey to see if he can help.

JH will speak to Angela McGibbon again regarding extending the proposed 20mph limit to the new houses.

KR asked if the barriers on the pavement at Station Road could be removed or if there is more work to be done. GE will email Steven Bly about this.

Confirmation of new member

CC members present unanimously elected Rob Davies to be a full member of the Community Council.

Police Report

On November 26th 2022 Police Sergeant Sarah Stephenson commenced her new role as Community Sergeant for the Forth and Endrick ward as well as supervisor for the Community policing Teams at Callander and Dunblane. She

has eighteen years Policing service, having previously worked in Callander.

There were various incidents regarding cars stranded or coming off the road near to Mugdock Country park, due to inclement weather. No serious injuries were sustained. The Park had an evening event in December which they will use to plan future events to try to minimise vehicles using the "Khyber Pass" during icy weather. Both Stirling and east Dumbarton Councils had to attend to close their respective sided of the road.

RD mentioned a landslip on the John Muir Way. A resident had already highlighted this and SCDT have contacted SC. The area is being repaired.

A resident raised the issue of the agreement between Forth Valley and Glasgow Health Boards. NHS 24 does not seem to understand the protocol that residents can use Glasgow hospitals. In an emergency we will still be taken to the nearest hospital. KR said that ambulances will use Forth valley if they think long term care might be needed. GE will email Evelyn Tweed about this and copy the original agreement to her.

A resident raised the fact that there is very little paint on the two mini roundabouts and drivers don't see them. The chevrons at the Devil's Elbow are also missing due to collisions. JH will email Angela McGibbon about this and also about the broken bollards outside the VC and the Church.

EM reported that the road signs at the junction of Cuilt Road and the A809 have been knocked down.

M Vass reported that they are still hopeful that the new library will be open in mid-February, but they are still waiting for papers to be signed by SC.

GE will email Steven Bly regarding the date for CC elections.

JG mentioned that Derek Edward is retiring after 47 years in the village. The Community Council wish him and Julie well in his retirement.

Lift up your spirits by dropping into the Village Club for a cuppa and company on any Wednesday between 10.30 and 12.30.


A grant raised by the Club committee funds hire of the room, hot drinks & biscuits, and the purchase of two portable air filters which help keep us safe from cross infections.




Lifelong learning courses: questionnaire results (December 2022)





















Library Kirkrooms News


Strathblane Wildlife Sanctuary

Secrets of the 1941 Lennoxtown Junkers Bomber Crash

Come along to Strathblane Heritage's special WW2 evening on February 20 (7.30pm Village Club) to hear the

remarkable story of how Scottish-based fighter planes shot down a German night bomber which crashed at Lennoxtown. Local amateur war historian Al Fleming has researched the fate of the Junkers 88 and its crew, and investigated the site of the crash. He will tell how a fascinating long-term relationship evolved between the family of a lost pilot and the people of Lennoxtown. And he will explain how by 1941 the increasingly effective air defences located around the Blane Valley played a large part in protecting the vital shipbuilding and engineering works of Clydeside from German raids.
