Are you tackling a local history project or looking for ancestors who lived here? Are you new to Strathblane and want to know more of its history? Maybe you are a local who enjoys trips down memory lane or likes browsing through old maps, photographs and postcards. If so, have a look at the website just launched by Strathblane Heritage: www.strathblaneheritage.org

For the past six months the SH committee has linked with Derek Townsend of Webreturn, who lives in Balfron, to gather as much material and as many images as we can to upload to the new website. We hope you like it!

The core of the site is the History & Heritage section, which is in three parts:

- A breathless dash through Strathblane's history from Dumgoyne's volcanic origins to the 2021 Census.
- A series of illustrated essays about various aspects of local history, including the Blane Valley Railway, Blanefield Printworks and Strathblane Parish Church. These draw on and augment the work of local historian Alison Dryden and Victorian antiquarian John Guthrie Smith. There are currently 19 essays, with plans to add at least six more. All suggestions welcome.
- Resources & Reminiscences. This section takes in documents and personal memories of life in Strathblane from 1796 until the 1960s. It includes all three Statistical Accounts of the parish (1796,1841 and 1951) as well as Harry and Helen Arnold's delightful film This is Our Parish, filmed in 1957-58, and memories of the old school. It also takes in the lives and deaths of the 27 local First World War servicemen who appear on Strathblane War Memorial as well as some with local links who do not feature on the monument.

The Gallery is a fascinating archive of postcards and photographs of local views, buildings and people. It includes a "slider" feature that enables the user to move the cursor and see how some of the old images look today.

An important resource for family historians is the Monumental Inscriptions section, which includes the results of three separate surveys of Strathblane Churchyard and Cemetery. The Maps section has a variety of maps from Joan Bleau's 1654 image of the Land of Lennox to contemporary maps.

We are hoping to build the section entitled Poetry, Song and Literature. Already you can listen to the Scottish traditional music group Ossian's beautiful recording of the traditional ballad The Braes of Strathblane. The website also contains news of recent, current and future Events and a Contact Us facility.

Membership costs just £10 a year. This gives free entry to our six winter meetings between September and March. Visitors £3 per meeting. The next meeting is on Monday 16 October at 7.30 at the Village Club when Pat Thomson of Balfron Heritage Group will give an illustrated talk entitled The Fabric of Our Lives about the cotton industry in the Blane and Endrick Valleys. Membership is £10 a year. Visitors £3 per session.

News from the SCDT Paths Group

Progress is being made by the Community Development Trust's paths group on the idea of linking up the north end of the Gary Wright Way at Station Road, to the West Highland Way at Dumgoyach, based partly on the new Scottish Water track.

That covers 1.5 km of the 2.5km over which we want to put a good walkable, cyclable track, but there are challenges still on this section which will need a better surface, and a solution to crossing a long-established agricultural access previously bridged.

We have been talking to Scottish Water about basic permissions, and the possibility of them providing financial or in-kind help, and await their response. We have walked the route with an officer from the Government-funded paths-grant body Paths For all, and had a very positive response. The next step will be a survey of local views on whether the link is actually needed. We will also be talking to surrounding communities, and are trying to involve communities of interest such as walking and cycling groups from further afield. Once the survey is under way it'll be vital to get plenty of responses if we want it to go ahead, so watch this space!!

We completed a morning of maintenance work last month, with drains cleared and vegetation cut around the Station Road link.

Strathblane Community Council September Update

JH welcomed everybody to the meeting, especially the Representatives from Greens

Matters arising

JJ told the meeting that the CC meetings would continue to held at the VC and we will pay for these from the admin grant.

Co-option of new members

Ian Boardley and Eleanor Balfour have submitted their cooption paperwork to SC and the members present agreed that they will be co-opted as soon as possible.

Police Report

PC Matt McCammon has joined the Community Policing team to work with PC McNulty.

People continue to burrow under or climb the fences around the quarry at Mugdock Country Park despite a huge amount of money being spent on fencing. Numbers entering the water appear to have reduced, but it remains a very dangerous place.

A male died as a result of a road traffic collision. Enquiries are ongoing to establish the full circumstances surrounding this tragic incident.

There was a road traffic collision involving three vehicles and damage to an exterior wall. The A81 was closed for a period as a result but fortunately no serious injuries were sustained.

There have been a number of reports of thefts/attempted thefts from potentially insecure cars. Please remember to secure vehicles.

A charity collection box was stolen from a commercial premises. Enquiries are ongoing to identify a male captured on CCTV.

Representatives from Greens.

We had a very positive question and answer session with Omar Ahmed and Louise Moreland from Greens. The CC had raised questions prior to the meeting and Omar addressed these, sharing their reasoning for the current set up in the store. They are prepared to take on board what the residents would like to see on the shelves.

Local Place Plans

Members of the CC attended a Teams meeting with SC about the Plan. We already have a lot of evidence that we can use, but we need to produce a questionnaire for residents. The latest census data should be available soon. A resident asked if we would work on the plan jointly with the SCDT. We intend to do this. A resident asked if there is an outline time scale for working through the plan. We do not have this yet. JG said that residents are welcome to join us in formulating this. RF said that it is recommended that we use as many methods as possible to contact residents.

The final Plan has to be submitted by April 2025, so we have time to work on it.

Rosemary Fraser asked if we could let her know about any safe routes that may need work that are identified by residents. Paths were considered important in our last plan. The Paths Group will be looking at this


