Grab Your Chance to Make A Real Contribution To Village Life

In the last BVB we appealed for members of the community to come forward and join the Strathblane Community Development Trust (SCDT) board to allow longstanding members to step down as charitable trustees. One person expressed interest, a newcomer to the village, but we desperately need more. Surely in our community there are residents willing to help us. Here is the appeal we made last time....

The SCDT is the main vehicle for enabling change to our village, raising funds and managing projects - helping the community to help itself. We need new Board Directors including a Company Secretary/Treasurer who are also charity trustees. The retiral of a number of director next year provides an exciting opportunity to help steer the development of the village over the next few years. Recent successes include the new library, the Bothy and many excellent paths, but this is your chance to set the next agenda.



Having delivered these great projects it is vital that SCDT maintains the momentum and continues to sustain our subsidiary Thomas Graham Library Ltd (TGLL) which owns the library on behalf of the community. As an established charity we also provide overarching support for many local groups such as the Blane Valley Allotments, the Campsie Crooners and we hope soon to add Strathblane Heritage.

How do we operate? The Board provides the overall governance of the organisation and our working or associate groups deliver our projects. No new project starts without volunteers to deliver them. The Board is likely to meet 4-6 times a year and will give advice and receive reports from groups on their progress and will approve grant applications.

Who are we looking for? We need four volunteers who are enthusiastic and have a desire to help the community. In particular we desperately need somebody with finance and accounting skills. This is a great opportunity to work with a group of enthusiastic people, while contributing to your own community. Training is available online through the Development Trust Association.

With an approved Local Place Plan, **our community-led local land strategy becomes part of the wider planning strategy** that Stirling Council will have to adhere to.



Strathblane Community Council December/January 24 Update

December Meeting

We discussed the proposed cuts to the bus services. The CC agreed to contact SC about how unacceptable it was for services in the rural areas to be cut. We recorded a vote of thanks to Val brand for her work on this issue.

We set a date for the Christmas tree switch on for December 15th and the inside of the hall will be decorated on the 9th. This year the carols will be led by the Campsie Crooners.

It was agreed that the first group meeting for the Local Place Plan will take place on February 12th.

JG mentioned that a resident has been pursuing the issue of power cuts with Alyn Smith. GE has emailed the Resilience Team at SC about this also but has had no reply yet. This is a huge issue for the area as when phones become digital there will be no means of communication for residents in the event of a power outage.

January Meeting

Police Report - There was a distraction theft/bogus workman incident in Blanefield. An unknown person purporting to be an employee of Scottish Water gained access to an elderly person's home and took a quantity of jewellery believed to be high value. Please continue to be vigilant and report any suspicious activity. Two members of the public reported scam messages/phone calls they have received purporting to be from the Police/PPI companies. Please be mindful of these common types of scams and who you share personal information with.

Dr McLean joined the meeting to discuss the removal of our district nurses from the local surgery. This is a trial

From Chair Julie Hutchison situation but happened with no consultation with the local doctors.

> We have written to Forth Valley Health Board regarding this issue and have encouraged local residents to write also. Nobody has had a reply.

> The doctors are concerned that our residents are losing out on care. Dr McLean said that in her experience patients do not want to complain.

> Any patient who cannot make the journey to Killearn can ask for a house call. The loss of the treatment room at our surgery means that more people have to ask for house calls, making the system less efficient.

> The doctor is no longer immediately available if a nurse in Killearn recommends further treatment.

> Dr McLean highlighted that historically patients in our area have been able to choose to be referred to a Glasgow hospital for treatment. Now about 1 in 3 referrals are being returned to the doctor to be sent to Forth Valley. The cross-boundary arrangement was agreed many years ago and it is disappointing that it apparently no longer stands.

Councillor Fraser reported that budget meetings are now taking place at SC. The Government is giving some funding to local councils to make up the shortfall in income due to the freeze on council tax.

We will continue to push against any proposals to cut the buses and the libraries.

It was reported that Finlay Fountain, a past member of the CC, died.

Blanefield Thistle 2023 review and 2024 forecast


2023 was an exceptional year for BTFC off the field, bringing in over £5,000, all of which will be re-invested into the club. The fund-raising quiz was a great success with over 100 people in attendance, raising £1,800. We will be running it again in June this year so please look out for tickets. The Thistleball is now bringing in a steady revenue for the club which has allowed us to become registered members of the Scottish Youth

Football Association (SYFA). We will be running coaching sessions later in the year. If more people enter we will be able to offer a 2nd prize. We gave away £300 in a special Christmas prize offer!. We are looking to invest some of the money raised to purchase a new ride-on lawnmower to help with grass cutting which has been exacerbated due to reduction in council visits. We will be carrying out repairs and decoration of the pavilion this year and looking into the costs of a new pavilion to replace the current one which is almost 50 years old. We really are trying our best to improve the club both on and off the pitch.

On-field 2023 season review from our Manager Jordan Dempsey : On the pitch the club finished the 2023 season in fourth place in the Forth & Endrick League, matching the previous season placing. We did however accumulate 4 points more than in 2022, so an improvement in that regard. The cup competitions saw us reach the final four of all three cups where we faced league winners Deanston in all three semi finals, unfortunately being beaten in all three to miss out on the chance of silverware. I look forward to welcoming the players back to pre-season training soon and hopefully seeing some new faces in attendance too.
