Award for Stalwart of Scottish Mountain Rescue

Congratulations to local resident, Dr Bob Sharp, who has been awarded the MBE for Voluntary Service to Mountain Rescue in Scotland.

Fifty years ago in 1976, Bob was involved in a serious mountain accident in Glencoe. Motivated to find more about the rescue service, he joined the Lomond Mountain Rescue Team. Over the next 20 years he was involved in several hundred rescues and, as Team Leader, responsible for numerous operational developments.

As Secretary, Chair and Statistician of the national body - the Mountain Rescue of Scotland (MRCofS) - he continued to oversee change in several areas - governance, communication, incident recording and funding. Bob has written several definitive books on mountain rescue, its history, and the Search and Rescue Dog Association and has served as a consultant to numerous rescue organisations in the UK.

His published articles on mountain rescue/safety along with hundreds of presentations and official work with Scotland's mountaineering organisations, have impacted significantly on our knowledge of the mountain rescue service and the promotion of mountain safety. Bob's lifelong commitment as a volunteer has been recognised with the MRCofS Distinguished Service Award, Fellowship of the Royal Geographical Society and now Membership of the Order of The British Empire.

Health

JH has contacted the Practice Manager at Edenkilt Surgery to address concerns of appointments for the B12 injections being moved from our surgery to Balfron and Killearn leading to people having difficulty getting appointments. An e-mail was sent to Alexander Polson, Team Leader of Clacks and Stirling Nursing Services. He replied that rationalisation was necessary due to budget restraints. We intend to continue pursuing this with the IJB.

Gary Neill sent information that they have submitted a capital funding bid to undertake any traffic management improvements identified in the surveys.

After complaints from residents we raised the fact that the hedge hasn't been cut for a year with Rosemary Fraser and the hedge has now been cut.

On Monday 16 March the society will hold its (hopefully brief!) AGM before welcoming Professor Richard Oram of Stirling University, who will present the remarkable story of the Lands of Lennox and the family that once held sway in much of West Scotland, including the Blane Valley.

Meanwhile work is progressing on creating text and designing the six boards that will be added to the existing Railway Path Sign to create the Strathblane Heritage trail. And later this year the society hopes to mount a modest exhibition to celebrate the centenary of the Edmonstone Hall.
